You Turn Bitter Pasts into **Bright Futures**

t was the first time I ever slept in a bed since fleeing my home when I was a young boy."

Bosco was born in the tropical Democratic Republic of the Congo. His father, a farmer, provided him and his six brothers and sisters with produce from the land. Fresh fruit and vegetables lined their tables and filled their bellies each day. His mother, a nurse who practiced with traditional medicine, cared for her children. Life for nineyear-old Bosco was good.

That all changed when the rebels came into his town, a once peaceful and bustling

village quickly became a death zone due to civil unrest. Bosco and his family were forced to desert their beautiful lives and escape to Rwanda for safety. Forced to become refugees relying on the help of others. Living on 24 cents a day, Bosco's belly was no longer full.

Bosco's upbringing led him to be diligent and do his best in everything. When he was selected as an Impact Hope student he was overjoyed. It was his first time to sleep in a bed and his first time to eat breakfast, lunch, and dinner in one day, since leaving (Continued on inside page)

Programs Launched Because of YOU!

Did you know that Impact Hope is going on its sixth year of serving refugee youth? That's because of YOU! We are so incredibly grateful for your support.

Because of your continued gifts, Impact Hope has been expanding its efforts to help refugee youth. While high school education continues to be the primary focus, we have developed and are implementing programs that guide current and graduated students to become successful tradesmen and business owners. Take a look at how these programs empower refugees!

Summer Trade Program:

Starting in 2017, Impact Hope has held a summer trade program each year (with the exception of 2020). This program allows students to spend part of their summer break in a safe, Christ-centered environment, while learning useful skills that will help them succeed after graduating.

This summer, **289 junior Impact Hope students** participated in a five-day empowerment program located at three different Adventist academies in Rwanda. The goal of this program was to help students develop a growth mindset for their dreams and see themselves as a part of the solution to ending poverty. Students were encouraged to find value in their own identity and create a vision for their future. They also learned entrepreneurship skills, how to develop a business plan, and reproductive health.

Vocational Trade School:

After students graduate high school, they are given the opportunity to go to a one-year vocational trade school. Trades include hairdressing, permaculture/agriculture, sewing, plumbing, maintenance/electricity, and culinary arts. This year, in addition to the graduated students, Impact Hope is sending 50 new young people from the refugee camps to go to a vocational trade school. These refugees have already graduated high school and went through a qualified selection process to be one of the 50 people supported by Impact Hope. They will also be receiving ongoing entrepreneurship training.



Small Business Training:

The biggest hope for refugees is to be self-supporting. After attending the one-year vocational technical school, students are encouraged to start their own small businesses. Graduates now have an on-the-ground Impact Hope staff member that coaches and mentors them as they start their businesses.
